 - Export to 50 countries







- For comparison
 - Canada exports \$4.5 billion
 - NB ranks 4th for seafood exports in Canada
 - Canadian lobster represents \$1 billion
 - China exports \$5.5 billion, with exports to the US reaching 1.3 billion in 2004 (more than doubled in 5 years).
 - NB exports to China now more important than any single EU market.

Example of Opportunities

- There is a major trend worldwide toward investing in marine biotechnologies and seeking optimum use of marine resources.
- It is estimated that there are more than 58,000 tonnes of co-products (waste or products that cannot be marketed for food) in New Brunswick. Most of these are processed into compost and fish meal.
- The use of co-products, often rich in bioactive molecules with unique properties (antimicrobial, anti-cancer), offers commercial potential that should be developed.
