MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act

4 June 2010

1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
 2. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated December 16, 2008 as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review;
 3. Although no archaeological sites are presently recorded at this location, there still exists the possibility of encountering unrecorded archaeological resources (of historic and prehistoric significance) during excavation activities. If the proponent suspects that he has come upon remains of archaeological significance, all excavation must cease and the Archaeological Services Unit, Heritage Branch (WC&S) should be contacted immediately at 453-2756.
 4. The proponent must conduct all sludge dewatering, storage and handling of the de-hydrated material, or storage of additives to the dewatering process within the existing building or the proposed new building expansion.
 5. The proponent must dispose of all dewatered sludge materials, and additives if any, at an Approved Regional Solid Waste Commission Facility.
 6. All waste processed must originate from within New Brunswick, and may consist of domestic septage waste only. Should the proponent choose to import septage or other waste from outside New Brunswick, it will require a separate EIA registration.
 7. All supernatant (liquid waste) derived from the dewatering process must be directed to the City of Edmundston waste water treatment plant via the municipal wastewater collection system.
 8. The proponent must obtain an updated *Approval to Operate* from the Department of Environment Grand Falls Regional Office. Please contact the Regional Engineer at 473-7744 for more information.
 9. In the event of a spill, the *Contaminated Site Management Process* as described in *New Brunswick's Guideline for the Management of Contaminated Sites* must be adhered to.
 10. The proponent shall ensure that all developers, contractors and operators associated with the construction and operation of the project comply with the above requirements.
