MINISTER’S DETERMINATION CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act

March 18, 2010

File Number: 4561-3-1242

1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation (87-83)* – Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated October 30, 2009, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section of the Department of Environment every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
4. If it is suspected that archaeological artifacts have been found during the construction of this project, all activities near the find will be stopped and the Manager of the Archaeological Services Section, Heritage Branch, Department of Wellness, Culture and Sport will be contacted immediately at (506) 453-3014.
5. A *Watercourse and Wetland Alteration Permit* must be obtained prior to the commencement of any activities within 30 m of the watercourse and/or the wetland. For more information, please contact the Manager of the Surface Water Protection Section, Department of Environment, at (506) 444-5382.
6. Fisheries and Oceans Canada’s (DFO) acting Oceans and Habitat Area Chief from Tracadie-Sheila must be notified 48 hours prior to the commencement of any construction works. The acting Oceans and Habitat Area Chief can be reached at (506) 393-3036.
7. The proponent shall ensure that all developers, contractors and operators associated with the construction and operation of this project comply with the above requirements.
