

## **DOCUMENT “A”**

### **MINISTER’S DETERMINATION CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act

May 19, 2010

File Number: 4561-3-1250

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1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) – Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated January 29, 2010, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section of the Department of Environment (DENV) every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
4. Imported waste can only be accepted at Daniels Sharpsmart Canada Limited’s facility from Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Québec, and/or Newfoundland and Labrador. Importation of waste from any other jurisdiction would require a new Environmental Impact Assessment registration before it could occur.
5. For at least the first six months of operation of the facility, no “red bag” waste can be imported from other jurisdictions. At the end of this six month period, the Manager of DENV’s Environmental Assessment Section will determine whether or not “red bag” waste can start to be imported from the previously approved jurisdictions listed in Condition # 4.
6. A new Approval to Operate for the facility must be obtained from DENV. For more information, please contact the Manager of the Industrial Processes Section, DENV, at (506) 453-7945.
7. An employee waste handling policy must be submitted for review and must receive approval from the Manager of DENV’s Industrial Processes Section before the facility can receive its Approval to Operate.
8. Up to 8760 metric tonnes per year may be treated at the facility and disposed of at either the West Hants Landfill in Scotch Village, Nova Scotia, or the Westmorland-Albert Solid Waste Corporation Landfill in Moncton, New Brunswick, as described in the EIA registration document, provided there is a signed agreement between the landfill commission(s) and Daniels Sharpsmart Canada Limited. The landfill commission(s) will determine whether shredding of the

waste or any other special handling requirements are necessary.
