MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL
Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act
19 March 2015
File Number: 4561-3-1389

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) – <u>Clean Environment Act</u> again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment and Local Government.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated 23 April 2014 and subsequent addendums, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager, Environmental Assessment Section, Department of Environment and Local Government (DELG) every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. A Certificate of Approval to Construct and Operate is required for this project and application must be made to DELG. Please contact the Industrial Processes Section, DELG at 453-7945 for more information.
- 5. The proponent is responsible for ensuring that all developers, contractors and operators associated with the project are familiar with, and comply with the requirements of the federal Migratory Birds Convention Act and the Species at Risk Act and associated Regulations.
- 6. If any remains of archaeological significance are discovered on site, as per the New Brunswick <u>Heritage Conservation Act</u> (2010) all activity shall be stopped near the find and the Manager of the Archaeological Services Unit, New Brunswick Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture shall be contacted at (506) 453-3014 for further direction.
- 7. In the event of the sale, lease, or any other conveyance or change of control of the Project, or any portion thereof, the Proponent must provide written acknowledgement from the lessee, controller or purchaser confirming that they will comply with the Conditions of this Determination to the Manager, Environmental Assessment Section, DELG.
- 8. The proponent shall ensure that all developers, contractors and operators associated with the construction and operation of the project comply with the above requirements.
