

Living arrangements of seniors

- Most seniors in New Brunswick reside in private dwellings. In 2016, 93.0% of the 148,785 seniors aged 65 years and older were living in a private dwelling compared to 7.0% that resided in a collective dwelling. Even among the 17,620 oldest seniors (those 85 years and over), more lived in private dwellings (12,385) than in collective dwellings (5,235).
- However, the proportion of New Brunswick seniors 65 years of age and older living in a private dwelling decreases with age. In 2016, their share fell from 37.0% for people aged 65-to-69 to 8.9% for those aged 85 and older.
- Conversely, the proportion of seniors living in a collective dwelling increases with age; their share jumped from 9.0% among the 65-to-69 age group to 50.5% among people aged 85 and older.
- Results were similar nationally. Seniors living in private dwellings saw their share fall from 35.4% among the 65-to-69 age group to 9.6% among people aged 85 and older.
- The share of Canadian seniors living in collective dwellings rose from 6.5% among young seniors 65-to-69 years of age to 54.2% among older seniors 85 years and older.
