

CHARLIES ROCK

DESCRIPTION

Location: Little Southwest Miramichi RiverStretch type: Regular Crown Reserve

Stretch length: 10.5 kilometres
Number of named pools: 15
River width: 15-37 metres

• River bottom: rock, rubble and large boulders

 Additional information: canoeing is <u>not</u> recommended because of rapids, large boulders, and slippery wading.

Boat and cable will be provided. Please bring your own personal floatation devices (PFD).

ACCESS (See corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

- 1. From Renous, travel west 20 km on Route 108 (Plaster Rock Renous Highway) to junction of Route 108 & 420.
- 2. From Junction of Route 108 & 420, bear left on 108. Travel 5 km to Little Southwest Miramichi access road (large gravel road on the right-hand side of Route 108).
- 3. On Little Southwest Miramichi access road, travel 38 km to junction 3 km past Mains Lake (Map 41 NB Atlas). Turn right in a northerly direction.
- 4. After turning right, travel 1.5 km to bridge crossing the Little Southwest Miramichi River (upper limit of stretch).
- 5. After crossing bridge, travel 3.9 km to Charlies Rock access road on the right.
- 6. On Charlies Rock access road, travel 3.6 km to Charlies Rock Camp.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates six (6) people
- Beds: three (3) double bunks with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, table, sink, benches, broom, mop, and outside toilet facilities
- Water: no running water. Anglers must provide their own drinking water.
- Wired for generator use
- Incidentals: all equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to
 minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried,
 buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining
 firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the Fish book for additional information.
