

CRAWFORD

DESCRIPTION

- Location: Northwest Miramichi River
- Stretch type: Regular Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 8 kilometres
- Number of named pools: 9
- River width: 9-24 metres
- River bottom: gravel, rock and large boulders
- Additional information: no rapids or falls; canoeing **not** advised, access is best by truck

ACCESS (See corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

1. From the city of Miramichi, travel 28.5 km northwest on Route 430 to Wayerton Bridge.
2. From Wayerton Bridge, travel 3.5 km to Fraser Burchill Road (gravel – left side).
3. On Fraser Burchill Road, travel 19 km to junction of Fraser Burchill Road. Bear right.
4. On right hand branch of Fraser Burchill Road, travel 13.5 km to the Crawford & Depot Crown Reserve Road (right side).
5. On Crawford & Depot Crown Reserve Road, travel 4.5 km to Depot Crown Reserve Camp.
6. At Depot Crown Reserve Camp turn left. Travel 2.1 km to Crawford Camp.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people
- Beds: four (4) single beds with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, table, sink, benches, broom, mop, and outside toilet facilities
- Water: camp has gravity fed water when conditions are favourable. **Anglers must provide their own drinking water.**
- Wired for generator use.
- Incidentals: all equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS
