

CRUICKSHANK

DESCRIPTION

- Location: North Branch Sevogle River
- Stretch type: Daily Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 4.5 kilometres from and including the mouth of Camp Doris Brook upstream to the confluence of the unnamed brook approximately 800 metres above Cruickshank Pool.
- Number of named pools: 15
- River width: 8-23 metres
- River bottom: gravel, rock, ledge, some large rocks
- Additional information: no rapids or falls. Anglers must wade the river to access lower pools. Lower pools have very steep banks – caution advised.

ACCESS

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

1. From the city of Miramichi, travel 28.5 km Northwest on Route 430 to Wayerton Bridge.
2. From Wayerton Bridge, travel 3.5 km to the mouth of the Fraser Burchill Road (this is a gravel road on the left).
3. On the Fraser Burchill Road, travel 8.0 km to the mouth of the Cruickshank access road on your left.
4. Travel the access road 1.3 km to reach the camp. The river can be accessed by following the trails upstream and downstream from the camp.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people
- Beds: one (1) bunk with mattresses and two (2) single beds with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, table, sink, benches, broom, mop, and outdoor toilet facilities
- Water: camp has gravity fed water when conditions are favourable. **Anglers must provide their own drinking water.**
- Wired for generator use
- Incidentals: all equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
