

JARDINE BROOK

DESCRIPTION

- Little Main Restigouche River
- Stretch type: Daily Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 8 kilometres
 Number of named pools: 12
 River width: 25-40 metres
- River bottom : gravel, rock, and ledge
- Additional information: most of the pools have rock ledges but between pools very little rock exists. Pools
 can be accessed by canoe. Motorized canoe is recommended, 6-10 hp. There are no falls or rapid. Canoeing
 up or downstream may be difficult during low water periods. There is one boat landing site.

ACCESS (see corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

- Distances given are approximate and may not correspond exactly to the reading on your odometer.
- Look for yellow Crown Reserve signs along the road.

Option 1: Access to this stretch may be provided by boat (the road appears in yellow on the map)

Travelling on Route 17 (from Kedgwick or Saint-Quentin)

- 1. From the intersection of Route 17 and Route 265 on the outskirts of Kedgwick, travel 2.6 km on Route 265 to the four-way intersection. Turn left at intersection and continue on Route 265
- 2. From the four-way intersection of Route 265, travel 10 km on Route 265 to the Montgomery Bridge crossing the Little Main Restigouche River.
- 3. From Montgomery Bridge upstream by boat 12 km to Jardine Brook Pool (start of Crown Reserve Stretch). Note: Canoeing may be difficult in low water periods and will require some canoeing experience.

Option 2: Travelling on Route 17 (from Kedgwick or Saint-Quentin) (the road appears in green on the map)

- 1. From the intersection of Route 17 and chemin Valcourt on the outskirts of Saint-Quentin, travel 5.3 km on chemin Valcourt and turn right.
- 2. Travel 1.4 km and keep right.
- Travel 1.4 km and keep left.
- 4. Travel 2.9 km and keep straight.
- 5. Travel 4.4 km and turn left (sharp turn).
- 6. Travel 4.6 km and arrive at the camp.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people
- Beds: two (2) bunks without mattresses
- Water: no running water. <u>Anglers must provide their own drinking water.</u>
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to
 minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried,
 buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining
 firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
