

LOWER KEDGWICK

DESCRIPTION

Location: Kedgwick River

Stretch type: Daily Crown ReserveStretch length: 12.3 kilometres

Number of pools: 24River width: 25 metres

River bottom: gravel and rocks

Access to pools is by canoe. Motorized canoe is recommended: 6-10 hp. No falls or rapids.

ACCESS (see corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

- Distances given are approximate and may not correspond exactly to the reading on your odometer.
- Look for yellow Crown Reserve signs along the road.

From Kedgwick

- **1.** From the intersection of Route 17 and Route 265 on the outskirts of Kedgwick, travel 2.6 km on Route 265 to the four-way intersection. Turn left.
- 2. Travel 10 km, still on Route 265, and cross the Montgomery Bridge over the Little Main Restigouche River.

To the One Mile camp

- 3. Turn right on the Rapid Depot Road and travel 2.9 km to the Tracy Road intersection. Turn right.
- 4. Travel 1.6 km to the Kedgwick River.

OR

To the Eight Mile camping site

- 1. Turn right on the Rapid Depot Road and travel 15 km to the Eight Mile Road. Turn right.
- 2. Travel 3.3 km on the Eight Mile Road.
- **3.** Merge to your left and continue for another 1.1 km to the boat landing and camping site. The upper end of the stretch is situated less than 1 km upstream.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- One Mile Camp: accommodates six (6) people
- Beds: two (2) bunks with mattresses and two (2) single beds with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, outhouse, fire-pit
- Wired for a generator
- Water: no running water. <u>Anglers must provide their own drinking water.</u>
- 8 Mile Camping Site: rudimentary facilities are available sheltered table, outhouse, fire-pit
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- For information on current salmon conservation measures such as live release requirements, visit the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada website.
- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
