

PEAKED MOUNTAIN LAKES

DESCRIPTION

- Location: Miramichi drainage
- Stretch type: Daily Crown Reserve

ACCESS

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

1. From the Village of Doaktown, travel 6.6 km North on the Hazelton Road and turn left onto the Hazelton Crossover Road (this is a gravel road).
2. Travel 11.6 km to a junction in the road. Bear right onto the Russell & Swim Road.
3. On the Russell and Swim Road, travel 10.1 km north and turn left onto the Valentine Lake Road.
4. On the Valentine Lake Road, travel 11.6 km to the end of the Valentine Lake Road. Bear right onto the Holtville Road.
5. On the Holtville Road travel 3.7 km north and turn right.
6. Travel 5.9 km to the Route 108 (Plaster Rock - Renous Highway) and turn left.
7. On the Plaster Rock Renous Highway (Route 108) travel 2.4 km and turn left onto the old Holtville Road heading south.
8. Travel south on this road 4 km to the access road on your right to Upper Peaked Mountain Lake or another 1 km to the access road on your right to Middle and Lower Peaked Mountain Lakes.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camping area only
- Fire pit provided
- Picnic table and outdoor toilet facilities
- **Anglers must provide their own drinking water.**
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS
