

## **LOWER NORTH BRANCH**

### **DESCRIPTION**

- Location: Lower North Branch Little Southwest Miramichi River
- Stretch type: Live Release Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 29 kilometres
- Number of named pools: 8
- River width: 6-18 metres
- River bottom: rock, boulders
- Additional information: canoeing is not advised, rapids, fast water, large boulders
- This is a remote stretch with very limited trail access.

### **ACCESS**

**NOTE:** Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

1. From Sunny Corner, travel north 2.2 km on Route 425. Turn left at Johnson Bridge crossing Northwest Miramichi River.
2. From the Johnson Bridge travel 1.5 km. turn right onto the Mullin Stream Road.
3. On Mullin Stream Road travel 2.2 km, turn left at the Y in the Mullin Stream Road.
4. From Y in Mullin Stream Road, travel 19.6 km, cross the Mullin Stream.
5. From the Mullin Stream crossing, travel 1.5 km, turn left at Y in Mullin Stream Road.
6. From the Y in Mullin Stream Road travel 4.9 km cross the North Branch Mullin Stream.
7. From the North Branch Mullin Stream crossing, travel 15.4 km. Approximately 0.6 km past the outlet of Guagus Lake bear right at Y in Mullin Stream Road.
8. From the Y in Mullin Stream Road travel 12.7 km to the Lower North Branch Stretch. This brings you to the camp site.
9. To access the river turn left and follow trail 260 meters.

### **ACCOMMODATIONS**

- No accommodations
- **Anglers must provide their own drinking water.**
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

### **REGULATIONS**

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
