

<u>UPPER CAINS</u>

DESCRIPTION

- Location: Cains River, tributary to the Southwest Miramichi River
- Stretch type: Live Release Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 10.7 kilometres (from the mouth of Lower Otter Brook, downstream to O'Donnell's camp)
- Number of named pools: 13
- River width: 15-40 metres
- River bottom: gravel, rock, and large boulders
- Additional information: no rapids or falls; canoeing is possible, accessible by truck and ATV

ACCESS

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

- 1. From the Village of Doaktown, travel 4.4 km south on Route 123 to the mouth of the Bettsburg Road (turn right).
- 2. Travel 9.9 km along the Bettsburg Road and turn left onto the Otter Brook Road.
- 3. Then travel 6.5 km to the Mouth of the Wathan Brook Road (turn left).
- 4. Travel 4.3 km to the Mouth of the Wildcat Road (turn right).
- 5. The Wildcat Road accesses the Upper Cains River stretch.
- 6. Otter Brook Pool can be accessed by traveling another 6.8 km southwest along the Otter Brook Road from the mouth of the Wathan Brook Road (turn left).
- 7. Travel 1.9 km to reach the Cains River. Walk upriver until you reach the mouth of Lower Otter Brook (this is the upper limit of the stretch).

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camping area only
- Fire pit provided
- · Picnic table and outdoor toilet facilities
- Anglers must provide their own drinking water.
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to
 minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried,
 buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining
 firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the Fish book for additional information.
