

SQUIRREL FALLS

DESCRIPTION

- Location: North Branch Big Sevogle River
- Stretch type: Regular Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 14.6 kilometres
- Number of named pools: 15
- River width: 5-12 metres
- River bottom: rocky with ledge outcrops
- Additional information: **Canoeing is not possible.** Walking trails are rough, not recommended for elderly people. A long steep staircase (70 steps) leads to the river. The upper reaches can be accessed by traveling in a westerly direction from the camp, past the Chester Mines road intersection in a northwesterly direction for 8.5 km, intersecting the river below Upper Camp Pool. **The road is suitable only for ATVs and older 4 wheel drive vehicles due to its rough and narrow condition.**
- The upper reaches can also be accessed from the north side of the river, by returning to the Fraser Burchill Road. At approximately the 36 km mark on the Fraser Burchill Road (from Rte. 430), a road on the left leads directly to the river.

ACCESS (See corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

1. From the city of Miramichi, travel 28.5 km northwest on Route 430 to Wayerton Bridge (Northwest Miramichi River).
2. From Wayerton Bridge, travel 3.5 km to the Fraser Burchill Road (gravel – left side).
3. On the Fraser Burchill Road, travel 10 km to the Sheepphouse Road access road (left side).
4. On the Sheepphouse Road, travel 1.5 km to the North Branch Sevogle River bridge.
5. From the North Branch Sevogle River bridge, travel 2.9 km to the Y in Sheepphouse Road. Stay straight at Y.
6. After Y in Sheepphouse Road, travel 13.3 km to the junction of the Sheepphouse Road and Peabody Lake Road. Bear left.
7. From the junction of the Sheepphouse Road and Peabody Lake Road, travel 1 km to Squirrel Falls Camp road (right side). Camp is on right.
8. On Squirrel Falls Camp road, travel 1.3 km to Squirrel Falls Crown Reserve.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people
- Beds: two (2) double bunks with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, table, sink, benches, broom, mop, and outside toilet facilities
- Water: no running water. **Anglers must provide their own drinking water.**
- Wired for generator use
- Incidentals: All equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS
