

THREE SISTERS

DESCRIPTION

Location: Main Restigouche RiverStretch type: Regular Crown Reserve

Stretch length: 6 kilometres
Number of named pools: 6
River width: 90-100 metres

• River bottom: gravel, rock, some large boulders

Additional information: access to the Three Sisters Stretch is by river only. Angling from canoe is the best method.
 Motorized canoe required (6-10 hp). No falls or rapids. River has swift current – wading not recommended.

ACCESS (See corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

- 1. From the intersection of Route 17 and Route 265 on the outskirts of Kedgwick, travel 2.6 km on Route 265 to the four-way intersection. Proceed straight on Down's Gulch Road.
- 2. On the Down's Gulch Road, travel 9.3 km to the first Y in the road. Bear left.
- 3. After the first Y in Down's Gulch Road, travel 2.6 km to the second Y in the road. Bear left.
- 4. After the second Y in Down's Gulch Road, travel 0.6 km to the Crown Reserve boat landing (yellow sign) on the Restigouche River.
- 5. From the Crown Reserve boat landing on the Restigouche River, travel 10.2 km down river by canoe to the Three Sisters Crown Reserve Camp on the right side at Snake Brook. Anglers should be aware that they will be traveling through private, leased and / or Crown Reserve waters.

 Please be respectful of other anglers. (Crown Reserve stretch is indicated by yellow signs.)

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people
- Beds: two (2) double bunks with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, firewood, table, sink, benches, broom, mop and outside toilet facilities
- Water: camp has gravity fed water when conditions are favourable. <u>Anglers must provide their own</u> <u>drinking water.</u>
- Wired for generator use
- Incidentals: all equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to
 minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried,
 buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining
 firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
