



2023 Wild Turkey Harvest Report

Summary

The 2023 wild turkey hunting season was the third wild turkey hunting season in New Brunswick. The 12-day wild turkey hunting season was open to residents of New Brunswick, took place from May 8th to May 20th and was a limited-entry hunt where individuals were required to enter a lottery to be drawn for a licence. Prior to entering the wild turkey draw, applicants were required to complete an on-line Wild Turkey Hunting Course. Over 8,700 individuals have completed the on-line Wild Turkey Hunting Course; 6,784 prior to last year's season and an additional 1,702 this year.

The number of licenses made available for the 2023 Wild Turkey License Draw increased by 100 licenses over 2022 to a total of 550 wild turkey licenses. An additional 25 licenses were made available in Wildlife Management Zones (WMZ) 10, 15, 16, and 20. The application period for the draw was from March 13th to April 7th. In 2023, 4,004 residents applied for one of the 550 available licences across WMZs 10, 15, 16, 20, 22, and 23. This is a 9.6% increase (352) in applicants over last year. Overall, the chances of being drawn for a licence was 13.7% (Table 1), up from 12.3% last year. Of the 550 licences drawn, 488 (88.7%) wild turkey licences were purchased (Table 2). Licence holders were limited to the harvest of one male (bearded) wild turkey.

Each of the 488 hunters who purchased a wild turkey hunting licence were required to submit a mandatory wild turkey harvest report; 417 (85%) wild turkey harvest reports were submitted by individuals who purchased their 2023 wild turkey hunting license. From the submitted reports, **190 wild turkeys** were reported harvested during the 12-day hunt (Table 3); 75 wild turkeys (39%) were harvested on the first day of the season and 149 wild turkeys (78%) were harvested during the first week of the season (Figure 1). The 2023 harvest was an 8% (+14 birds) increase over the 2022 harvest (Table 4). The overall success rate was 47% which is a decrease from the success rate of 50% in 2022.

Overall, 100 more wild turkey licenses were available in 2023 compared to 2022, 112 more licenses were purchased, and 14 more wild turkey were harvested. It should be noted there are still 71 outstanding reports yet to be received; however, it is believed the reported harvest would not significantly increase if the outstanding reports were submitted.

Wild turkey hunters spent an average of 17 hours hunting wild turkeys during the 2023 season. Successful hunters spent an average of 10 hours hunting (range of < 15 minutes to 80 hours) and unsuccessful hunters spent an average of 23 hours hunting (range of 1 to 100 hours).

Wild turkey hunters spent an estimated minimum of 6,825 total hours hunting wild turkey and had observed a minimum of 6,764 wild turkeys throughout the season. This results in a minimum of 0.98 turkeys observed per hour of hunting (Table 5). Overall, wild turkey hunters saw an average of 16.8 wild turkeys while hunting. Successful hunters saw an average of 19 turkeys while hunting, while unsuccessful hunters saw an average of 14 turkeys while hunting.
