

2023 RESIDENT MOOSE DRAW

IMPORTANT FACTS:

- Resident hunters who want the opportunity to hunt moose must have a New Brunswick Outdoors Card number to enter the Resident Moose Draw.
- Prior to applying, all applicants must meet Hunter Education requirements (see below).
- Applicants must be 18 years of age or older at the time of application, have their principal place of residence in the Province of New Brunswick and must not have had their hunting privileges revoked under the authority of the New Brunswick Fish and Wildlife Act.
- Application fee is \$9.55 Conservation Fee and HST included and is non-refundable.
- Applications are limited to **one** per person.
- Moose licences are NOT transferable or refundable.

- You may apply for only one Wildlife Management Zone (WMZ). Before choosing a zone, familiarize yourself with WMZ boundaries by visiting the DNRED Go Hunting webpage and consult the table on the next page for WMZ licence quotas.
- Canadian Forces and RCMP members residing in New Brunswick may apply for the Resident Moose Draw online, or in person at an authorized vendor or Service New Brunswick Centre.
- An amendment to the Fish and Wildlife Act allows New Brunswick-born serving members of the Canadian Forces and RCMP to apply for the Resident Moose Draw the same as any New Brunswick resident regardless of where they live or serve. HOW TO APPLY

- Resident Moose licences are allocated by a random computerized draw.
- Applications can be made online at www.gnb.ca/fishwildlife and by clicking Buy a licence / Apply for a Draw / Get an Outdoors Card. Online applications are accepted until June 9 at 11:59 p.m.
- Applications can be made in person at any authorized vendor or Service New Brunswick location until the close of regular business hours on June 9.

HOW TO CHECK RESULTS

- Results will be available online, on July 4, at www.gnb.ca/fishwildlife and by clicking Apply for a Draw.
- Successful applicants will be sent a variety of important documents. Please ensure your mailing address is up to date.

HUNTER EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

- All gun hunters born on or after January 1, 1981, and all first-time gun hunters must complete a Firearms Safety / Hunter Education course.
- Gun hunters who were born prior to January 1, 1981, and who are not first-time hunters, may show a previous hunting licence as proof of experience.
- All bow hunters and crossbow hunters must complete a recognized stand-alone Bow Hunter Education course or if born prior to January 1, 1981, have proof of a previous hunting licence allowing use of a bow or crossbow.
- Firearms Safety/Hunter Education and Bow Hunter Education certificates from other provinces, territories and the United States are valid in New Brunswick.

Be sure to follow all requirements under the Fish and Wildlife Act and the Moose Hunting Regulation. Consult the **Hunt & Trap book** for more information.


