

One award per Regional Heritage Fair site.

The New Brunswick Provincial Showcase Award is given to the best Heritage Project in the Regional Heritage Fair.

Criteria for the award:

- Project must have a New Brunswick or Canadian Heritage theme and entail some research conducted by the participants. Projects can be specific to one time-period or display a thematic development or progression.
- Students may prepare projects as individuals or in groups.
- Students must provide written research that was undertaken in developing their projects.
- Students may only receive the award once during his /her participation in heritage fairs.
- In the same fair, the award recipient(s) may also be selected as another award/medal recipient.

The award recipient(s) must:

- Present a high-quality project which focuses on a relevant subject on New Brunswick or Canadian Heritage;
- Show a high-level of enthusiasm for learning about New Brunswick and Canadian Heritage;
- Present solid research using primary and/or secondary sources;
- Include a strong visual representation that summarizes the research, in an original and engaging manner;
- Express their research and thoughts with clarity and coherence in an oral presentation.

The recipient(s) will receive:

- A commemorative plaque;
- A gift from the New Brunswick Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture;
- An invitation to present their project to the Honorary Patron, the Lieutenant Governor, and receive a medal in an official ceremony;
- Recognition on the NB Heritage website and social media.
